Key findings from a survey of 1,000 Hispanic voters nationally fromJuly 18-23, 2023

Methodology: Public Opinion Strategies is pleased to present the key findings of a national survey. The survey was completed July 18-23, 2023, among 1,000 registered Hispanic voters, and has a credibility interval of $+3.53 \%$.

Interviews were completed in:
Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia, and Wisconsin.

Jim Hobart was the principal researcher on this project. Torie Bolger was the project director, and Trey Segrist provided analytical support.

## Political Environment

Hispanics are negative about the direction of the country.
"Would you say that things in the country are going in the right direction, or have they pretty seriously gotten off on the wrong track?"


Hispanics are divided on President Biden, but intensity is against him. Independent Hispanics are a major problem for the President.
"Do you approve or disapprove of the job Joe Biden is doing as President?"


The partisanship we see nationally extends to Hispanic voters.
"Ifthe 2024 elections were being held today, would you be more likely to vote for...
the Republican candidate, ...or... the Democratic candidate?"
